BOARD OF DIRECTOR'S UPDATE

North Somerset Parent Carers Working Together was formed in October 2017 and changed status to a CIC in September 2020. This change meant that rather than being run by a committee it is now formed of a trio of directors, members of staff, parent reps and a steering group. The reason behind becoming a CIC was to ensure we as a forum are more sustainable and stable to ensure the best provision is available for parent carers in the North Somerset region. We continue to work with our strategic partners in both the local authority and health in order to affect change, improve provision and services for children and young people with send and alleviate the worry for their parent carers.

During the past year, we have struggled and been affected by the covid 19 pandemic as everyone else has been, however, it has unfortunately become clear that parent carers of those children with additional needs and disabilities have been adversely affected by the lack of services and support during the various lockdowns. We quickly became accustomed to the online world and started to offer online zoom links for parents. These included our chance to chat coffees to allow parent carers some adult interaction with those who were facing the same kind of challenges, as well as wellbeing sessions, coping with anxiety sessions, multi professional sessions to give parents a platform on which to ask questions of those in charge of services and provisions.

In a small way, we are proud to know we have helped a small number of parent carers to feel less alone and more supported, and we are looking forward to growing our reach within the community of parent carers in North Somerset to continue to support and to share their voices with those able to facilitate change.


SURVEY STATISTICS


233 parent carers responded to our survey declaring that they have a child aged 0-25 and has any additional need or disability living in North Somerset.

Q2. How do you rate services/provision in North Somerset for children and young people (aged 0-25 years) with additional needs and/or disabilities?




Q6. What is your experience of **telling your child's story** as few times as possible?




Q3. Do you feel your child's educational setting is

Q5. How do you rate social care services your child accessed?




FINANCE UPDATE

NSPCWT's accounts are independently examined, and a financial statement produced by Godfrey Wilson Limited, Chartered Accountants & Statutory Auditors.

Almost all our funding has been received from Grant funding this year with our core participation grant from the Department of Education of £15,000 along with a further £10,000 discretionary grant. £5000 from North Somerset Council and £10,000 from the CCG was received to support the forum during Covid with a further £32,200 grants via Quartet for forum development and parent carer training.

Total income for 2020/21 £56,210, in addition to this we have deferred income of £28,718 for use in 2021/22 (This includes a Training Grant of £11,680 and NHSE resource development held on behalf of 3 parent carer forums, NSPCWT, Bristol & South Glos, £7,038)

The CIC incurred costs totaling £55,575 leaving a pre tax surplus of £635.



NEXT YEARS PLANS

For the year 2021/2022 we have four areas on our work plan that we address at a strategic level using full input from parent carers to drive the need for change. These are identified high priority areas from our annual survey. The areas we are working on this year are:

- Covid-19 response
- Education
- Health with a focus on CAMHS
- Social Care

Alongside our very comprehensive training package which will be running throughout the next 12 months, we also have 4 large scale events. These are run in partnership with other agencies within North Somerset and allow parent carers to talk to multiple professionals in one day. They are:

- Local offer event, showcasing all that is on offer in the area 29/09/2021
- Meet your Councillors and Health Commissioners 07/10/2021
- Transitions event, from 0-25 including preparing for adulthood 10/11/2021
- Social communication and Autism fayre March 2022 (date tbc)



FUTURE PLANS

The forum's long term aim is to become a sustainable, inclusive and non-judgmental space to offer a wide range of support for our parent carer community. We are extremely passionate and driven and hope to open two resource centres within North Somerset in the future to ensure we have the ability and capacity to build our community and ensure everyone's voice is heard.

Initially, we will set up a hub in Weston-Super-Mare, to facilitate our office requirements along with providing a hub for parent carers. Hubs will feature a safe, relaxed space where parent carers can receive informal support through coffee events, learn about support that is available to them to help them to make informed choices, along with facilitating more formal support through workshops and training. The hub will be used as a resource for the community with the expectation that it will be used by all stakeholders and other voluntary organisations in providing information and support to our community.

We also feel there is a huge need to develop some parent carer peer navigators to help the navigation through what is often a maze of support, benefits and forms. We would be keen to explore how this role could be developed and offer additional benefits around the personalisation and social prescribing.
